

YOUTH AND CYBERBULLYING: What Families Don't Know Will Hurt Them


Did You Know?

Studies of young people using the Internet indicate that 35 percent of them have been targets of cyberbullying and more than 10 percent (approximately 4 million in the United States)

have bullied others online. For some of these youth, online cruelty may be a precursor to more destructive behavior, including involvement in hate groups and bias-related violence. "Youth and Cyberbullying" is designed to help adult family members address this critical issue.

This program will:

- increase understanding and awareness about the problem of cyberbullying.
- educate and empower adult family members to effectively discuss and respond to their children's/teen's experiences with cyberbullying.
- provide adult family members with the tools/skills needed to educate their children/teens in responding to cyberbullying and in being allies to others.
