


10 Color Schemes



1. Primary:
Red, Yellow, Blue
2. Secondary:
Orange Green, Violet
3. Intermediate:
Red-Orange, Red-Violet, Yellow-Green, Yellow-orange, Blue-Green, Blue-Violet
4. Monochromatic:
one-color-range of dark to light values (shades and tints) of that color-for example: pale light blue, light blue, blue, dark blue, midnight blue.
5. Warm Colors:
Red, Red-Orange, Orange, Yellow-Orange, Yellow
6. Cool Colors:
Green, Blue-Green, Blue, Blue-Violet, Violet
7. Complements:
two colors on opposite sides of the color wheel – for example: Red and Green; another example: Red-Violet and Yellow-Green
8. Split Complements:
One color and the two colors on the immediate sides of the first color's complement - for example: Yellow and Red-Violet and Blue-Violet
another example: Green and Red-Violet and Red-Orange
another example: Blue-Violet and Orange and Yellow
9. Neutral:
Gray, Black, White, Brown
10. Analogous:
3 to 5 colors immediately next to each other on the color wheel, that share a common hue(“a slice of color pie”) For example: Red, Red-Violet, Violet, Blue-Violet are analogous and share the color Red.
