Materials: Pattern Blocks (9 blue and 3 green); paper, pencils, and crayons for recording

Use 9 blue and 3 green pattern blocks to make a pattern.

1. Record your pattern.
2. Describe your pattern in 2 different ways.
3. What comes next? How do you know?
4. How did you decide what pattern to make?
5. Make a different pattern. Record your pattern.
6. What comes next? How do you know?
7. How is this different from the first pattern?
