School Area Eligibility Street Assignments

DATE: March 15, 2006

The new list of area eligible elementary schools, used for making Tier I eligibility determinations for day care homes in CACFP, was transmitted on February 8, 2006 with Operational Memorandum #05H-06. This list included schools where 50% or more of the enrolled children are eligible for free or reduced price meals in the National School Lunch Program. The new school data was effective **February 1, 2006** and the following information regarding street assignments is provided to identify the areas associated with each school:

- There have been no changes in street assignments in the following communities: Ansonia, Bridgeport, Bristol, East Hartford, Enfield, Groton, Hartford, Manchester, Meriden, Naugatuck, New Britain, New Haven, Stamford (KT Murphy School), Stratford, Torrington, Vernon, Waterbury, West Haven and Windham.
- Street Assignments for Norwich have not changed. There were two new schools listed for Norwich but these schools are for children with special needs. As they serve no specific neighborhoods, they cannot be used to establish area school eligibility.
- New street assignment lists or maps are attached for the following communities: Bloomfield, Danbury, East Haven, Hamden, Middletown, New London, Norwalk and Stamford (Rogers School).
