School Nurses: FTEs and Ratios

- o Thirty-five of 37 Hartford schools (95 percent) reported the services of a school nurse.
- o The Hartford district ratio of students to school nurses is greater than the ERG I and state averages; i.e., Hartford school nurses work with more students when compared to the ERG I and state averages.
- o Twenty-four of 37 Hartford schools (65 percent) report student to school nurse ratios that are greater than the state average. The ratios at three high schools (Bulkeley, Hartford Public and Weaver) are approximately three to four times the state average.

o **Guidance Counselor** services are available in approximately one-third of Hartford schools. All high schools, K-8 schools and middle schools reported guidance services, except at Breakthrough and Webster. They serve students in Grades 7-12 only.

o Twenty-one of 37 Hartford schools (57 percent) reported **School Psychologist** services; however, central office itinerants serve all schools.

o All schools reported **School Social Worker** services, except at Greater Hartford Classical Magnet and Pathways to Technology.

o All schools reported at least one **Reading Specialist** assignment, except Bellizzi Middle, Breakthrough, Pathways to Technology and Sport and Medical Sciences.

oAt Hartford high schools, **Students to Guidance Counselor** ratios are highest at Greater Hartford Classical, Sport and Medical Sciences and Weaver (greater than 250 students per counselor). Two K-8 schools do not have guidance services, Breakthrough and Webster. The traditional middle schools serve approximately 250 students per counselor.

oThe Hartford district ratio of **Students to School Psychologists** in a school is almost twice the state average; that is, Hartford school psychologists work with almost twice as many students as the state average.

oAlmost all Hartford schools have at least one **School Social Worker**. The Hartford district ratio of Students to School Social Workers is less than half the state average; i.e., Hartford social workers work with half as many students compared to the state average. Twelve schools reported more than 500 students per social worker.

oAlmost all Hartford schools have at least one **Reading Specialist**. The Hartford district ratio of Students to Reading Specialists in a school is greater than the ERG I average and less than the state average. Hartford reading specialists work with more students than other reading specialists when compared to the ERG I average. Eleven schools reported more than 500 students per reading specialist.

*Please note that when a staff member works less than full time, the ratio will be greater than enrollment.

**A ratio of zero (0) indicates that the school does not have a counselor, psychologist, social worker and/or reading specialist.

***The Hartford ratios include central office itinerants; assignments to other programs or adult education are not included.

- o **Forty-one percent of Hartford schools (15 of 37) have a higher percentage of newly assigned teachers compared to ERG I. Also, 51 percent of Hartford schools (19 of 37) have a higher percentage of newly assigned teachers compared to the state average.**
- o **The percentage of teachers with three or fewer years of experience ranges from 4.3 percent to 62.5 percent in Hartford schools.**
