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## Special Populations Updates

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### Connecticut Alternate Assessment Results Available

On November 10, 2016, the Connecticut Alternate Assessment (CTAA) Results for English language arts/literacy and mathematics were released electronically through the American Institutes for Research (AIR) Online Reporting System (ORS). Individuals with the appropriate permission level may access them. Districts should have received paper copies of the CTAA Individual Student Reports on November 21 and 22. Two copies of the paper reports will be provided in addition to the *Connecticut Alternate Assessment Report Brochure for Parents*. One copy of the individual student report should be maintained in the student file. The second copy should be provided to parents /guardians with the provided brochure.

The [2016 Guide for CTAA Score Report Interpretation](#) has been developed to support appropriate use of the CTAA student reports. Additional resources related to the CTAA are located on the CSDE Comprehensive Assessment Program Portal in the [Connecticut Alternate Assessment Resources](#) card. Some of these include the [CTAA Mathematics Performance Level Descriptors](#) and the [CTAA English Language Arts/Literacy Performance Level Descriptors](#), as well as the [Parent Overview of Connecticut’s Alternate Assessment System](#).

### Clarification of TEA User Role for Alternate Assessment

Every teacher administering the Smarter Balanced Assessments, the CMT or CAPT Science, the Connecticut Alternate Assessment (CTAA) and the CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science must have their own username and password to access the CSDE Portal and the Test Information Distribution Engine (TIDE) system. For teachers administering the Alternate Assessments (the CTAA and/or the CMT/CAPT Skills Checklist Science) the District Administrator (DA), District Coordinator (DC), or School Coordinator (SC) must assign the user role of Teacher Administering the Alternate (TEA), rather than the Teacher (TE) role. This will allow these teachers to have the same access permissions as their colleagues with the teacher role, in addition to the critical Alternate Assessment required permissions, such as access to the *Directions for Test Administration for the CTAA*.



## Special Populations Updates

### Assessment Guidelines

The [2016-17 Assessment Guidelines](#) is posted to the Student Assessment web page under [Special Populations Documentation and Resources](#). This resource provides guidance to Connecticut school district personnel who must make decisions about testing special student populations on the Smarter Balanced Assessments, CMT Science, the CAPT Science, CMT Skills Checklist Science, the CAPT Skills Checklist Science, and the CTAA. These special student populations include students identified as eligible for special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), students identified as disabled under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and students who are identified as English Learners (EL). This decision making also includes general education students who may require additional supports.

Students' embedded accommodations, non-embedded accommodations, and designated supports must be set in TIDE prior to test administration for these settings to be reflected in the online test delivery system.

### Text-to-Speech and Read Aloud Guidelines and Form

The [Text-to-Speech and Read Aloud Decision Guidelines 2016-17](#) form must be completed for any student in Grades 3 through 8 who will receive the accommodation of Text-to-Speech or Read Aloud of English language arts/literacy (ELA) reading passages on the Smarter Balanced assessments. This form can be completed online and submitted by clicking on the **SUBMIT FORM** button. The [Text-to-Speech and Read Aloud Decision Guidelines 2015-16](#) created by Smarter Balanced will provide you with information about determining if a student qualifies to receive this accommodation.

## Connecticut SAT School Day Updates

### ELA and Mathematics Workshops

The College Board, in conjunction with the CSDE, will be providing several train-the-trainer workshops in December in the areas of English language arts (ELA) and mathematics. The no-cost workshops are intended to prepare school and district staff to train their teams on content of the SAT. Each school (including Approved Private Special Education Programs) can register **two staff members** to participate in a half-day workshop. Department leaders, teachers, curriculum specialists or others who expect to present this training to their respective district teams are invited to attend. 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**Student Assessment Inventory**

Achieve recently announced the launch of the [Student Assessment Inventory for School Districts National Network](#). The goal of the National Network will be to support up to 12 school districts across the country to use the [Student Assessment Inventory for School Districts](#) to take stock of their assessment system, streamline the number of assessments, and ensure all remaining assessments are of high quality and aligned to state learning standards.

The [Student Assessment Inventory for School Districts](#), which Achieve launched in 2014 in response to concerns from parents about too much testing, supports a process by which districts evaluate the assessments students are taking, determine the minimum testing necessary to serve essential diagnostic, instructional and accountability purposes, work to ensure that every district-mandated test is of high quality, is providing the information needed for specific school and district purposes, and is supported by structures and routines so that assessment results are actually used and action steps taken that will help students.

Through Achieve's National Network, Achieve will provide districts subgrants between \$5,000 and \$7,000 to districts to complete the assessment inventory. In addition, district and school board leaders from those districts will attend a cross-district convening to learn from other districts that have used the assessment inventory and to finalize inventory planning, as well as receive ongoing support from Achieve staff.

**PSAT Results**

The College Board will be releasing results shortly for students who took the PSAT in October 2016. On December 5, 2016, schools will be able to access their students PSAT results through the College Board portal. On December 12, 2016, students who took the PSAT will be able to access their results through their College Board online account. **English Language Proficiency Testing**

The annual English Language Proficiency (ELP) testing window will run from January 3, through March 10, 2017. This year, **LAS Links, Form D will be administered**. As in previous years, the Kindergarten-Grade 2 assessments will be administered using paper and pencil. We encourage districts to consider administering the online assessment for Grades 3-12, but paper and pencil is still available at those grade levels. Please note, that for the first time this year, decisions about online versus paper and pencil administration may be made at the **student level**, rather than by grade level, which was past practice.

Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) will be providing four half-day trainings at ACES on **December 14 and 15, 2016**. Sessions will be offered from 8:30-11:30 a.m. or 12:30-3:30 p.m. each day. During the half-day training they will address: scheduling online test sessions, reporting accommodations, and how to successfully administer the LAS Links Online. Districts may send up to three participants to the in-person training. Registration information can be found [here](#).
